AS IT HAPPENS

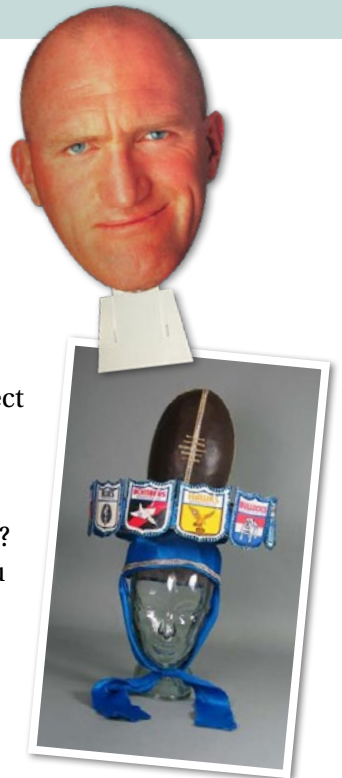
